THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The past year for the Foundation has been exciting and rewarding as we have raised funds to support a variety of needs in health care in the North Okanagan. In November we launched our Tower of Care Campaign – Phase II, with a goal to raise

\$2.5 million to equip the top two floors of the new Polson Tower. Sixty new beds will help alleviate current overcapacity issues and transition larger bed wards to single and double patient rooms, allowing for better infection control, faster recovery times, and greater privacy. Thanks to the hard work of our campaign committee and its co-chairs, Dr. Chris Cunningham and Richard Finn, and to the generosity of our community as a whole, the Foundation has raised nearly \$1.6 million, well over half our goal, in less than a year. It is expected that construction of the top two floors will be completed in 2016.

We have also been honoured to be a part of the Digital Mammography Campaign, which we expect to reach its goal of \$428,400 for a new digital mammography machine this fall. This is thanks to generous individual donors, the Coldstream Women's Institute, VantageOne Bollywood Bang, the Prospera Dragon Boat Festival, Wine Women and Woods at Predator Ridge, the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation BC/Yukon, the 2014 Ladies of the Okanagan Golf Tournament at the Rise, The Longhorn Pub Rock for Care and Bosom Buddies.

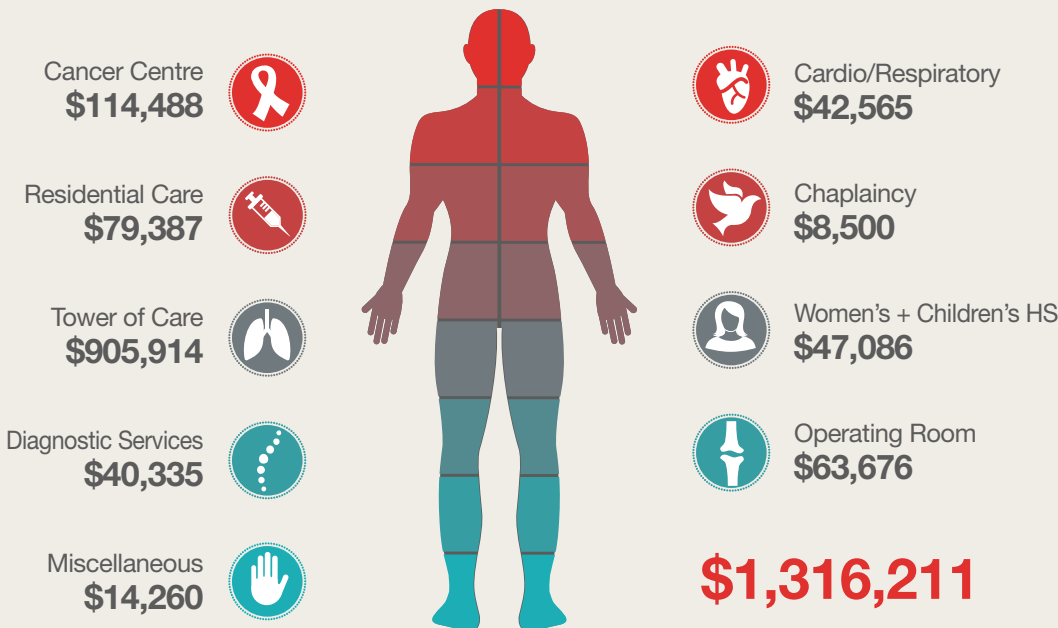
The Foundation launched its new website in December, and the Board wishes to thank our Public Relations Committee and our staff for all of their efforts in bringing this large project together.

REASONS FOR GIVING

Vernon Jubilee Hospital Foundation was pleased to receive a \$50,000 donation for the Tower of Care Campaign from former owners of TekMar Control Systems Ltd., Don and Ulrike Gibbs. Mr. & Mrs. Gibbs have lived in Greater Vernon since 1984, when they helped found what became a thriving local family technology business. The business was sold in 2012.

When the Tower of Care Campaign, to raise funds to furnish the 6th and 7th inpatient floors at Vernon Jubilee Hospital, was launched in November 2013, the Gibbs came forward to make a significant donation. "The hospital expansion is a community project that most of the population will use and benefit from at some point in the future. Everyone will need the hospital one day or another," said Mrs. Gibbs.

The couple has close ties to Vernon Jubilee Hospital; their four children were born at VJH and Don Gibbs sat as a voluntary member of the VJH Ethics Committee for ten years. He and his wife have had interactions with other hospitals, but see Vernon Jubilee as part of this community's core services. "It is a place where there is a stable pool of employees and physicians who have a long history of working together. VJH offers more neighbourly care, unlike the less personal environment that can be felt in hospitals that have higher staff turnover," says Mr. Gibbs.

The Gibbs's donation has been designated to one of two new Rehabilitation Activity Rooms that will allow patients easy access to necessary rehabilitation equipment, enabling faster recovery times.

"We like to take leadership roles or work with others to get things done," said Mrs. Gibbs. "Like Greatheart, we seek to assist others along their journey of life," she said, in reference to the character in the literary classic 'Pilgrim's Progress'. Mr. & Mrs. Gibbs have collaborated with the Foundation to achieve better inpatient care at VJH, which is at the core of their admirable concern for the well-being of others.

COLDSTREAM WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

Women's Institutes have been operating in BC since 1909, with the Coldstream branch being formed in 1931. The BCWI is an educational organization for women and families. It is for women interested, informed and involved in building a better tomorrow. The group's hall is located on Kalamalka Road, and has been a big part of the municipality of Coldstream for years. The sign outside says, "Coldstream Women's Institute, 1937. It is a valuable gathering place and the heart of the community. WI members have worked over the years, managing and maintaining the Hall. It has served as a functional space for a variety of events including Girl Guide and Boy Scout meetings, weddings, birthday parties, all candidate meetings, coffee houses and even the Coldstream Farmers' Market.

The Coldstream WI has history of supporting the community in many ways. They have provided both voluntary and financial support to many individuals and organizations over the years. Examples include scholarships for Okanagan College students, donations to the North Okanagan Hospice Society, the Vernon Food Bank, Mental Health, Therapeutic Riding (NOTRA) and the Vernon Jubilee Hospital Foundation.

With a declining membership and those who remain are getting older and the next generation not volunteering the same way as earlier ones, the WI members decided to sell their property to the District of Coldstream. \$50,000 of the funds raised, from the sale of the building, was donated to the Foundation's "Take a Picture" campaign to purchase a Digital Mammography unit at VJH. This is a wonderful legacy from the Coldstream Women's Institute given to the women of the North Okanagan and beyond.



EAST MEETS WEST

The South-Asian Community of the North Okanagan is a generous and caring one. The Sikh religion, to which many belong, teaches followers to help the poor and love their neighbours. Followers are encouraged to develop moral character through generosity, humility and self-reliance. VJHF board member, Dalvir Nahal explains it best, "Our culture really teaches us to give back. That's actually one of the principles of Sikhism. Charity is a huge thing in the Sikh religion."



Thanks to Foundation volunteers, like Dalvir and Ranvir Nahal, Gurjit Jhaggi, and many members from the South-Asian community, more than \$150,000 has been raised for different Vernon Jubilee Hospital Foundation initiatives since 2011.

The community's first appeal raised over \$36,000. Encouraged by Dalvir, a small group canvassed members of the South Asian community for donations to the Building a Tower of Care Campaign. The Foundation has continued to benefit from gifts in kind and financial contributions like those made through cookie sales at local Subway restaurants, thanks to owners Gurjit Jhaggi and Raj Jaswal. When the McMurtry-Baerg Cancer Centre required a \$500,000 expansion and renovation, personally Dalvir committed to raise \$50,000. Personal asks and samosa sales, run by the Punjabi Heritage Society,

helped the Foundation meet its financial commitment to the Cancer Centre.

During the McMurtry-Baerg Cancer Centre campaign, a novel fundraising idea, Bollywood Bang, exploded. Modelled after a traditional Indian reception that would follow a Sikh wedding, Dalvir & Ranvir Nahal and Sunny Dhaliwal, introduced the North Okanagan to a taste of Indian Culture. Members from the South Asian Community helped out with everything, from henna painting, to sari wrapping, to the donation of beautiful traditional costumes that were sold to participants as part of the fundraising. Traditional food and entertainment were provided by community members. In its second year when tickets went on sale last January, VantageOne Bollywood Bang sold out in 5 days and has become “a must attend” event. It has raised \$63,500 net in two years.

The Foundation is grateful for the leadership, generosity and financial support that has come through the North Okanagan’s South Asian Community.

15TH ANNUAL DO IT FOR DAD, PRESENTED BY INTERIOR SAVINGS, RAISES \$33,372!

There comes a time in a man’s life when he eventually has to answer that nagging wake up call. For Ed Eyford, it happened

shortly after he turned 50. Ed was diagnosed with prostate cancer at the age of 51. “It wasn’t even on my radar” he said, even though his father had died from that same disease. “It wasn’t something I wanted to talk about.” Things weren’t fine. Keeping the worry bottled up led to increased stress for Ed, and he suffered a heart attack one month before his scheduled prostate surgery. “I wanted the surgery... I wanted it out of my body” he said.

Now at 74, Eyford is a crusader for the Cause. After his experience, he thought about other men going through the same thing. “If there were a way someone going through this would be able to talk about it with others who have been there, it could really help them.” He learned about the Vernon Prostate Cancer Support and Awareness Group (PSA Group) that was formed by Les Ashbaugh and Al Appleyard.

Although Ashbaugh has since passed away from the disease, his legacy is alive through the ongoing efforts and dedication of the PSA Group. “In the past 22 years I’ve missed a few meetings, but only a few,” said Eyford. The PSA Group meets each month at The People Place, providing men and their families with vital information and support.

Last Fathers’ Day, the community walked and ran for the men in their lives who have been affected by prostate cancer. The VJH Foundation ‘Do It For Dad Run & Walk’, raised \$33,372 for diagnostic equipment for Urology at VJH, as well as affording free PSA screenings for North Okanagan men and funds to support the good work of the Vernon Prostate Cancer Support & Awareness Group.

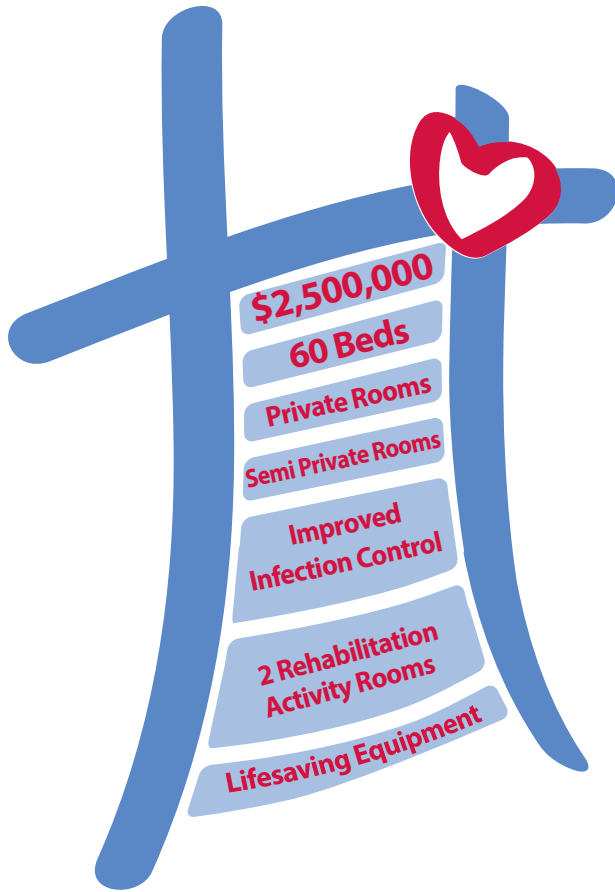

BUILDING A TOWER OF CARE CAMPAIGN

Phase II



In September 2011 five floors of the Polson Tower opened at Vernon Jubilee Hospital. This brought state of the art facilities to many departments of the hospital. As part of the construction, two additional floors were shelled in for future use as inpatient wards.

Once the new hospital was in use, it quickly became apparent that VJH required improved capacity. That capacity would need to come from the completion of the top two floors of Polson Tower.

The \$29.6 million project to convert two shelled-in floors into acute care wards will be completed and opened to the public in early 2016. There will be a total of 60 beds on these two floors that will not only improve capacity but also increase patient comfort, privacy and safety.

In the spring of 2013 VJH Foundation agreed to raise \$2.5 million to purchase beds and lifesaving equipment for the 6th & 7th inpatient floors.

Early morning on November 7, 2013, the Foundation officially launched the fund raising Campaign at The Prestige Hotel. Nearly two hundred people attended the event.

Thank you to the Tower of Care, Phase II Campaign team who have accepted the challenge to raise 2.5 million dollars.

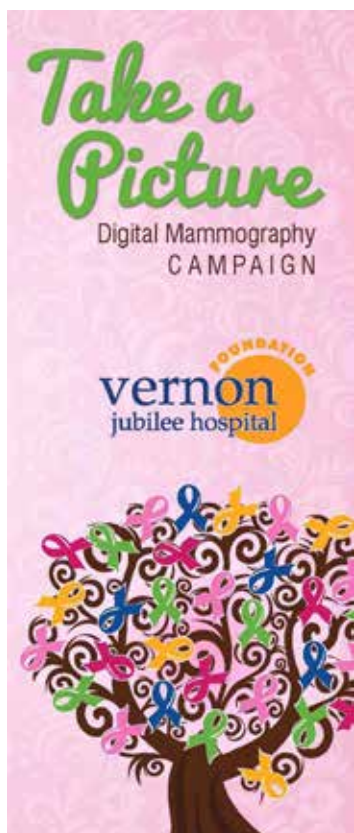
The community has shown outstanding support for the Campaign. A generous \$250,000 pledge to name the sixth floor has come from the Vernon Kiwanis Club – Four Seasons. Donations have come from many individuals including significant gifts from Neil & Gillian Woolliams, Don & Ulrike Gibbs, Robert Foord, and Irma Feke. DIGITAL MAMMOGRAPHY CAMPAIGN



In the spring of 2013, VJH Foundation entered into a partnership with the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation BC/Yukon, Wine Women and Woods, Vernon Bosom Buddies and the Prospera Vernon Dragon Boat Festival to support the “Take A Picture Campaign”, to raise \$428,400 for a Digital Mammography machine for VJH. Currently the unit operates with analogue technology which is rapidly becoming obsolete. Finding replacement parts for film system technology continues to present challenges for staff in the Mammography Unit.

Funds raised through the Take A Picture Campaign will help purchase a

new digital mammography machine; radiologists’ and technologists’ workstations & software, and essential equipment accessories. As well, it will fund the installation and renovations required to house the new unit. When completed in late 2014, the Digital Mammography machine will mean better breast images, fewer call backs for women and operational cost savings for VJH.

Over the past year and a half, events like Wine Women and Woods, the Prospera Vernon Dragon Boat Festival and VantageOne Bollywood Bang have directed efforts to make digital mammography a reality for Vernon Jubilee Hospital. Donors have come forward to support this cause. \$50,000, from the sale of the CWI Institute Hall, has been received from the Coldstream Women’s Institute, and generous donors have come forward to contribute.
